Examples of mail delivery from my A to Z listing are - Archer, Bucket, Cannon Ball, Donkey, Elephant, Floating Safe, Glider, Hang Glider, Ice Skates, Jumpers, Kayak, Llama, Mule, Noddies, Ox, Parachute, Quad Bike, Ropeway, Ski, Stilts, Tractor, Underground railway, Van, Yacht and Zeppelin - to name but a few. I am still looking for a delivery method beginning with the letter "X"! 2. The 'Tin Can Mail' of Niuafou'ou (Tonga) This display (Open Philately) is the story of Niuafou'ou and its Tin Can (Canoe) Mail Service 1882-1983. The island of Niuafou'ou is the remotest island within the Kingdom of Tonga, and is about half way between Fiji and Samoa. It is actually the peak of a sub-oceanic volcano with no beaches, no harbours and no good anchorage. Passing ships, anchor a long way off shore, and native swimmers had to "swim" the mail out to these ships and collect the incoming mail in sealed biscuit/kerosene tins. Later, outrigger canoes were also used to provide this service. It continued for 101 years up to 1983, when an airstrip and terminal was constructed which brought the Tin Can (Canoe) Mail service to an end. My 128-page entry at Stampex 2015 and 2016 in the Open Philately class was awarded a Gold. Included are maps, Miniature Sheets, Specimen stamps, monochrome, bromide and cromalin proofs, postcards, photographs, newspaper reports, Government Acts and Orders in Council and Philatelic Bureau information sheets, Tin Can Mail Study Circle memorabilia, 1982 Tin Can Mail Centenary Official Cover artwork, letters, an extensive range of covers for all years from 1930 to 1948 inclusive, and material that is infrequently seen and/or available in relatively small quantities.

POSTMAN'SKNOCK This is a slide show showing the development of the postal service in England from the 16th to the 20th century, with examples from Warwickshire. The display follows the history of the post from the Merchant Adventurers in the time of Queen Elizabeth I, to the mail coach era and the postal reforms of 1840 and the impact of improved communications in the early 20th century. If required special emphasis can be made of a particular area: Alcester, Bidford-on-Avon, Stratford-upon Avon, Warwick/ Leamington Spa, Rugby, Nuneaton, Coleshill, Coventry, Atherstone, Shipston on-Stour, Southam, Studley or Henley-in-Arden. In addition to the slide show, a standing display of postal history can also be provided 2. TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH This is a thematic display following the history of polar exploration. It begins with the explorers of the 16th century, who first attempted to discover the route of the North West Passage and follows the Golden Age of polar exploration (19th century), when John Ross, Sir John Franklin, Sir James Clark-Ross and others failed to find the northern route from the Atlantic to the Pacific. In the 20th century attention turned towards the North Pole with Peary, Cook, Nansen and Amundsen sending expeditions and creating much controversy in the process. The second part of the displays follows those explorers reaching out to the South Pole. Starting with the earliest expeditions of James Cook, Von Bellingshausen and Clark-Ross, the display traces many of the lesser known expeditions as well as the success of Amundsen and the failure of Scott and Shackleton's expeditions. 3. THE FALKLAND ISLANDS THROUGH STAMPS This is a display explaining the history of the Falkland Islands through stamps, from the earliest issues, the "Black Frank" and "Red Frank", through the Victorian/Edwardian/Georgian definitives to the Elizabethan pictorial issues of the 1990s (depending on the number of display frames available). It also includes a comprehensive selection of postal stationery of the islands. Many of the errors, essays, design work and stamp related ephemera of the Islands add interest to the display. 4. THE LAST EXPLORER This display looks the life and career of Sir Hubert Wilkins, a little known Australian polar explorer, naturalist and photographer whose amazing life took him to live among the Eskimos in Canada, receive the Military Medal and Bar in World war I, to travel on Shackleton's final expedition, to fly across the Arctic (and receive a knighthood in recognition), to travel in a submarine under the polar icecap, to be the first person to fly in Antarctica and to travel on the first round-the-world voyage of the airship, Hindenburg. The story is told with stamps, postal history, postcards and photographs, including much contemporary material. 5. ROWLAND HILL - GENIUS & BENEFACTOR This is a slide show following the life and works of Sir Rowland Hill, one of the most influential men of the nineteenth century. From humble beginnings in Kidderminster, Hill was an inventor, and (with the help of his family) a teacher and an innovator in education. He also, despite much opposition, reformed the Post Office, and introduced Uniform Penny Postage, which in turn led to a huge increase in literacy in the country. Hill received many honours, including a knighthood, before his death in 1879 at the age of 83
