Lancaster Royal Grammar School Stamp Club at Europhilex 2025



On Thursday 8th of April LRGS stamp club adventured to the NEC in Birmingham for this once in a 10-year experience. We were greeted by John Davies and Erene Grieve from Stamp Active, inviting us to the junior section. As soon as we got there, we were given an activity booklet to fill in. We had to collect different variations of British stamps such as the Northern Irish Machin and hinge them into a booklet. The booklet was then marked giving a maximum of 250 points. These points were later used for a mini auction.

We then had time to explore some of the two thousand exhibits. We looked at the world's

most expensive stamp, the one cent magenta from British Guiana. Stamp Active gave us £20 in tokens to spend on stamps and coins at the many dealers that were there. Robin Cassell also gave us each a penny red with our initials on. Stamp Active held an auction to finish off the day. There were various items including First day covers and special stamps. At the end one of the boys won a Penny black and a Two pence blue from Stamp Active. We all had a lovely time, and we are thankful to all the staff who help run the junior section to make it such a special day.











Younger Members entertain at the Royal - a credit to the Society.

"A credit to the Society' was how John Stimson FRPSL described the displays presented at the meeting of the Royal Philatelic Society London on 24 April when it was the chance to let 'The Younger Members Entertain'. Ten rose to the challenge, although many others were simply unable to take up the opportunity.

The idea originated when Simon Moorcroft FRPSL approached Michael Roberts, at the time a Vice President of the Society, suggesting that the younger members demonstrate how passionate they are about the hobby. Sadly Michael, enthusiastic to turn the idea into reality, died before it came to fruition.

The ten who showed were Johan Agren, Tiegan Berry, Magnus Cameron, Clement Chevallier, Paris Dimitriadis, Dzintars Grinfelds, Hayden Moorcroft, Simon Moorcroft FRPSL, Jack Preuveneers FRPSL and Ricky Verra. Coming from France, Sweden and the United States, as well as the United Kingdom, understandably not all could be at the meeting in person.

Giving the Vote of Thanks, John added that it has been 'a treat to see such fantastic exhibits with a wonderful diversity of material, showing high levels of research and study, and fine presentation'.

President of the Society, Simon Richards RDP, FRPSL, thanked all those who had shown, and in particular Simon Moorcroft for turning his concept into reality.







From Wednesday 7 to Sunday 11 May, EuroPhilEx Birmingham 2025 welcomed visitors from all corners of the world to the biggest philatelic event of the year.



In his welcome message in the exhibition catalogue, Jon Aitchison, EuroPhilEx Chairman, noted that this is the first British international exhibition to be staged outside London since Manchester 1899. Also in the catalogue, Bill Hedley, FEPA President, quoted: It will be an occasion for the philatelic world to come together, rekindle its enthusiasm, and have a good time.

Stamp Active was present on Stand 1 with fun activities on the theme of "Brilliant Britain", free goodie bags and lots of stamp fun. Many young visitors received free vouchers to the value of £20 to spend at the Show.

Other highlights of the event included 2,000 exhibit frames, a magnificent Court of Honour, more than 60 dealer and trade stands, a live philatelic auction, society meetings, the Roll of Distinguished Philatelists Ceremony, the Philatelic Congress of Great Britain, the FEPA Congress, and two FEPA







'BRILLIANT BRITAIN' 1 PAGE YOUTH COMPETITION:

Stamp Active Network are pleased to announce this year's competition based on Great Britain which could include any aspects of history, geography or nature or people and much more....the possibilities are endless.

Young people up to the age of 18 (on 1st September 2025) are eligible to enter. UK Only. **Entries should be submitted by 31st August 2025.**

Entries will usually be displayed in the Youth Zone as part of STAMPEX.

Stamps, covers and other philatelic items can be used. For this competition only, it is acceptable to use images of stamps that are not your personal property. The page must have a title, and either captions or a short write up that tells the story. The entries can be either hand-written or prepared using a computer.

A scan of the page should be sent

to stampactive@btinternet.com by 31st August 2025. When sending your scan, please include your age as at 1st September 2024 and your full postal address (so that we know where to send any prize).

There will be four age groups – Up to 7; 8-10; 11-14;15-18: – with prizes being awarded (*for First, Second, Third*) in each age group.

THE STAMP ACTIVE COMPETITION;

Entries can now be prepared ready for the 2025 Stamp Active Competition.

THE STAMP ACTIVE COMPETITION, sponsored by the Great Britain Philatelic Society, was introduced in 1998 in the national competitions to encourage new entrants. The equivalent of an "Open" class, it allows a minimum of four pages (rather than sixteen for the British Youth Stamp Championships) but can then be increased to up to 24 pages. It is judged on presentation and originality (not FIP rules). Medals are awarded in the same way as other competitions for every entry. There is a prize of £50



voucher for the winner in each class (minimum of three entries) to be used for philatelic items. Additional Special prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges. This is a great way for young collectors to start their journey in stamp competitions. The best overall entry receives an additional £50. There is also an opportunity to submit a group entry.

Entry forms for this competition should be submitted by 31st July 2025 and the completed exhibit received by 31st August 2025. The winning entries will be displayed at the Royal Philatelic Society London at an Autumn event (date to be agreed).

BRITISH YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS;



Entries can now be prepared for this competition.

The British Youth Stamp Championships, sponsored by the Great Britain Philatelic Society, are organised by Stamp Active Network as part of the National Competitions. The Championships are open to all young collectors up to the age of 21 normally resident in the United Kingdom.


The best overall entry receives a prize of a £100 voucher to be used for philatelic items and each age group winner receives £50.

Special prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.

Entry forms for this competition should be submitted by 31st July 2025 and the completed exhibit received by 31st August 2025. The winning entries will be displayed at the Royal Philatelic Society London at an Autumn event (date to be agreed). Exhibits that achieve a Large Silver Medal in this competition will be eligible for entering competitions at international level.

BTA ONE PAGE VIRTUAL COMPETITION



The British Thematic Association has announced a new virtual competition, which includes sections for young collectors. Have a Go, Show!

- Up to and including age 9
- Ages 10 14
- Ages 15 17

There will be seven philatelic classes; Thematic Philately – Nature; Thematic Philately – Science and technology; Thematic Philately – Culture; Open Philately; Topical; Picture Postcards; Youth Philately.

The exhibit page must have a clear title on it, and must tell a story (with the exception of Topical entries), not a list of stamps or a procession of stamps but material that is linked to tell the story. Maximum marks for the **Youth entries** will be scored as follows: The Story (max 20); Knowledge of the material used (max 20); Variety of material (max 20); Presentation (max 40)



INFORMATION

The Stamp Active Network is a voluntary group that promotes stamp collecting for children. Amongst its other initiatives, it runs a free postal club for children, KIDSTAMPS, the national youth stamp competitions, the Youth Zone at Stampex and has published a range of free activity books for youngsters.
